## Shoot れesults

## Cloth of Gold Bowhunter Challenge 25th June 2023

The second shoot of the year put on by us at Cloth of Gold welcomed 84 archers to our ground on the hottest day of the summer.

We had $2 \times 20$ double-pegged targets ready and waiting, well concealed in our popular mixed woodland course with the usual aim of providing a real challenge for everyone taking part.

This shoot was created by our course setters to encourage interest in the Bodnik Bowhunter Challenge and to provide an alternative to our regular Open Shoots. Target 'kills' gained points and 'wounds' were penalised.

The aim was to make a shoot with as few restrictions as possible while still operating under NFAS safety rules and shooting at more realistic hunting ranges of under 30m, with a greater use of small shooting 'windows' and awkward shooting positions.

Because of this and to minimise damage to the double pegged targets, compound bows, crossbows and use of longrods sadly had to be excluded from this shoot.

Shooting styles were also minimised to:

Class 1, wooden arrows off the hand.
Class 2, wooden arrows off the shelf or arrow rest.

Class 3, non-wooden arrows off the hand, shelf or rest.

Otherwise archers could shoot as they wished within NFAS safety rules.
Scoring also had a major revamp, again influenced by the Bodnik Bowhunter Challenge.
First time round the course, (Red pegs) archers shot two arrows, both counted, with the score for a kill as 10, score for a wound as minus 2 and a miss 0 . Second time round the course (Yellow pegs) archers shot 1 arrow with the score for a kill as 20 , wound as minus 5 and a miss as 0 . Any hits on hooves or horns also scored as minus 2.

The challenging part of the course being to get those kills! And yes there were negative scores this being more of a 'different' shoot than a normal competition.

The farthest target distance was kept at under 30 m but some devious course laying, together with use of the ground and target sizing, created shots that often appeared much further away or closer than they were.

We provided our popular full catering service throughout the day and water stops were laid out on the course as temperatures were forecast to reach 30 degrees.

As always, we had lots of positive comments at the end of the shoot on the challenges of the course itself, as well as a few queries about the classes and restrictions we had to include, to make the shoot as fair as possible to everyone taking part.

Thanks to everyone who travelled to take part, to our course planners and setters, stewards and volunteers on the day, and as always, the catering for their high quality food produced all day in sweltering heat and endless good humour.
